THE FINNIGAN BROS. BAND IS TRULY AN OUTLAW BAND. IT HAS TWO GRIZZLED OLD VETERANS OF THE MUSIC BUSINESS... AND AN OUTLAW.

Mike Finnigan is a legendary sideman who's played keyboards with such artists as Jimi Hendrix, Joe Cocker, Dave Mason and Crosby, Stills and Nash, among others. He's also released solo projects, most notably on Columbia Records and Warner Bros. where he recorded a self-titled album at Muscle Shoals Studios produced by R&B legend Jerry Wexler.



Robb Royer is a founding member of the seventies hit factory "Bread," and he won an Oscar in 1970 for Best Original Song. He has written or co-written hits for a number of artists including Mary Chapin-Carpenter, Ray Charles, The Carpenters, John Michael Montgomery and Randy Travis, moving to Nashville along the way.



Sean Finnigan started out as a piano player and singer in a band like his older brother, but things went awry and he wound up singing the blues behind bars. With his debt to society paid, he worked in television and advertising for many years and is now the co-author of a book on the subject of addiction and intervention with Mike's wife Candy, who appears regularly on the hit TV series "Intervention."



Robb had worked with each brother individually for years, but in 1989 they finally all got together and cut an album that they didn't quite finish. Not liking the only deal they were offered, they put it away "for a while."

Cut to 2008, when Mike and Robb decided to take a chance at putting the album out themselves. So in this brave new world Robb went to work, transferring the analog tapes to digital format. With the help of engineers and players like Harrison Holmes, Chris Clark, Brandon Henegar and John Toomey, the pieces finally came together.
